EPISODE GUIDE



Feminist movements have the power to disrupt the status quo and radically alter the course of history for women and girls—and ALL historically marginalized people and communities globally. But what does it really look like to be a feminist leader today?

From Global Fund for Women and directed by two-time Academy Award-winner Sharmeen Obaid-Chinoy, *Fundamental* profiles a distinct set of remarkable grassroots leaders working on issues from ending child marriage in Pakistan to pursuing LGBTQI liberation in Georgia. These incredible leaders are at the front lines of fighting for gender justice and mobilizing to write new futures for themselves, their societies, and the world."

HOSTING A SCREENING

- 1. Select which of the five episodes you'd like to screen for your audience. Each episode is approximately 17 minutes, so you may screen one or multiple episodes at a time and may host more than one event.
- 2. Once you've selected the episode or episodes for your screening, simply fill out this form.
- 3. Someone from our team will respond within 1-3 business days with next steps to confirm your event, which will require you to select a date/time and location. If you'd like to host another public screening, you must receive written approval from the screening team.

EPISODE GUIDE

- 4. Once confirmed, we will send you a screening toolkit, including robust discussion and educational resources, social media guides and graphics to help you promote your event to your community.
- 5. Engage local professors, activists and community members to secure speakers for your post-screening panel.

EPISODE BREAKDOWN

Each episode has a runtime of approximately **17 minutes**. We recommend pairing two episodes with a discussion for your event.

Episode 1 Rights Not Roses: Ending child, early, and forced marriage in Pakistan

In Pakistan, we meet **Zarmina**, who was married at age 13 to a 28-year-old man, who abused and starved her until her parents found out and helped Zarmina escape the marriage. We also hear from a network of community activists fighting to end the scourge of early and forced marriage in Pakistan, where 21% of girls are married before the age of 18. These include **Rukhshanda Naz**, a human rights attorney and longtime women's rights leader who is fighting in Pakistan's courts to extricate girls like Zarmina from early and forced marriages, and whose passionate advocacy for ending child marriage is informed by her family's own experiences with the issue.

Episode 2 **Defenders of Justice**: Fighting racism and patriarchy in Brazil In Brazil, we meet **Lucia Xavier**, who is part of a movement to reframe reproductive rights as an issue of women's rights and racial justice, as she and others work to address security threats against their activist community. We also meet **Daniele Duarte**, an Afro-Brazilian lesbian activist who protests and marches against the rise of the extremist president Jair Bolsonaro. Lucia and Daniele are among the changemakers mobilizing what some are calling a "Feminist Spring" in Brazil as the Supreme Court considers decriminalizing abortion.

Episode 3 Living Out Loud: LGBTQI rights in Georgia

In Georgia, we meet **Eka Aghdgomelashvili**, a Georgian feminist activist and trailblazer who led successful efforts to pass anti-discrimination laws in this former Soviet state homophobic ideologies and strong ties between the church and state still exist We also meet young artist **Eka Tkemeladzeand**, and fellow community activists who are mobilizing in the tense days leading up to the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia (IDAHOT) rally.

Episode 4 Girls at the Heart of It: Comprehensive sexuality education in Kenya In Kenya, we follow two young women from Akili Dada, a women-led grassroots organization with programs focused on empowering girls and young women to become leaders in Kenya through sexual and reproductive health advocacy. We also meet **Purity Kagwiria**, Akili

Dada's Executive Director, whose own personal experiences have led her to a lifelong commitment to support women and girls in her community.

Episode 5 **Rising Power**: Building an intersectional justice movement in the United States

In Madison, Wisconsin, we meet community organizers **Kabzuag** and **M**, co-directors of **Freedom Inc.**, a grassroots advocacy organization fighting for the rights of Black, Hmong and Khmer, women, girls, queer and trans people. Driven by their own intimate experiences of violence and poverty, M and Kabzuag have carved out a space for multiracial, multilingual, and multigenerational community members to disrupt a broken system and provide the community with the tools they need to confront oppression in all facets of their lives, and ultimately build a roadmap toward shared liberation.

How to Host a Virtual Screening of **FUNDAMENTAL**

On COVID-19 and Convening

With COVID-19 affecting all in-person gatherings, the following is a guide for alternative viewing options for hosting FUNDAMENTAL community screenings. These options ensure the safety of our communities while providing shared viewing experiences to watch, discuss, and support movements for gender justice.



Different Types of Virtual Events

Depending on the type of event you want to have, we have different recommended platforms to encourage you to use.

Grassroots EventsPost-Screening Conversations

Because FUNDAMENTAL is currently available on YouTube, you can easily share the episode <u>links</u> with your audience and send them an invitation to a virtual panel or conversation.



We are also sending private screeners for each episode via the platform Indee, which allows for a more distraction-free/ad-free experience. Always feel free to contact us: fundamental@picturemotion.com

To complement your viewing, we recommend the following platforms for hosting thoughtful discussions to engage your community post-screening. These platforms do not allow for co-viewing.

Zoom:

- Allows for HD screen sharing; Ideal for smaller, more intimate post-screening discussions
- Allows up to 100 participants (and has Large Meeting add on if you need more)
- Rates: Free (for up to 40 minute sessions) ---- \$19.99/mo

Crowdcast

- Live video (great for panels); Fine for audience numbers up to 3k; Can record event to share later with stakeholders and new audiences
- Allows for audience chat and polling
- Rates: Starter \$20/mo ----- Business \$139/mo

<u>GoToWebinar</u>

- Up to 1,000 participants in standard mode
- Platform could facilitate a Q&A, polling and can integrate video
- Rates: Lite- \$49/mo --- Enterprise \$399/mo

Facebook Live

- Easy to use if host is familiar with Facebook, gives opportunities for company to receive funds without paying the platform to use services
- Audiences can subscribe to company's account or react to videos
- Rates: Free


Virtual Event Best Practices

- Keep your events to 90 minutes or less (including screening)
- Set event time based on viewing and engagement patterns of your audiences (i.e. avoid dinner time if your key demographic is parents)
- Keep any panel to 4 participants or less to encourage more time for each speaker to contribute.
- Local subject matter experts are a great addition to a thoughtful discussion
- We recommend audiences pre-screen one or two episodes and concentrate the discussion around that episode or general topics of gender inequality

Virtual Event Technical Best Practices for Moderators and Panelists



- Test your internet connection and prepare your lighting at least 20-30 minutes before the event
- Make sure your browser is up to date
- Use headphones
- Close down all unnecessary applications and close all unnecessary windows



Guidance on How to Avoid Zoom Bombs and Create a Safe and Secure Event

During this time of frequent virtual convenings, unauthorized persons have been intruding on Zoom meetings.

Here are recommendations from Henry Fernandez (Center for American Progress) and David Sifry (Center for Technology & Society at the Anti-Defamation League):

- Convert Zoom Meetings into Zoom Webinars this provides the host with MORE robust moderation features (<u>meetings vs. webinars</u>, <u>scheduling a</u> <u>webinar</u>)
- Configure the Webinar Settings in Advance disable the chat feature and Q&A feature. End registration once the meeting begins or by a designated time. Do not allow people to register with new identities as the meeting is ongoing (this allows someone to be kicked out, but re-enter).



- Do not put an open zoom meeting link on the web a meeting could easily be bombarded this way.
- Treat entry to virtual space like entering a physical building consider validating identities of attendees if you would like to invite them to use audio at any point or to show video as a panelist. This means going one-by-one as people arrive. This is better for smaller events. Otherwise, almost everyone should remain an attendee who can only view the content. Attendees can only be unmuted by the host. Once the meeting starts, you can "lock the door" as the host.
- If problems persist, promptly end the event this can be a traumatic experience and our attendees (survivors, students, their families) may be especially affected by this.
- Communicate with attendees explain what happened to the extent that is possible, but ask attendees to refrain from spreading news of the incident, especially just afterward. If it gets public and in the media, it would be a major victory for the perpetrators and much more difficult to manage. No one wants a PR crisis now. This is often the goal.
- Record events this enables us to preserve evidence for professional investigation after the fact and possible tracing to the source.
